Everyday Missionaries

The next day Jesus decided to go to Galilee. He found Philip and said to him, "Follow me." Now Philip was from Bethsaida, the city of Andrew and Peter. Philip found Nathaniel and said to him, "We have found him of whom Moses in the Law and also the prophets wrote, Jesus of Nazareth, the son of Joseph." Nathaniel said to him, "Can anything good come out of Nazareth?" Philip said, "Come and see." Jesus saw Nathaniel coming toward him and said of him, "Behold, an Israelite indeed, in whom there is no deceit!" Nathaniel said to him, "How do you know me?" Jesus answered him, "Before Philip called you, when you were under the fig tree, I saw you." Nathaniel answered him, "Rabbi, you are the Son of God! You are the King of Israel!" Jesus answered him, "Because I said to you, 'I saw you under the fig tree' do you believe? You will see greater things than these."-John 1:43-50

As some of you know, from 2018-2023, I was honored to serve as a member, and for a while, as co-chair of one of the Mission Teams of the North American Lutheran Church: the Renewal Team. Our work on the team was focused on developing and promoting practical recourses for ministry, renewal, and mission to the congregations of the NALC, its pastors, and other workers. In my first year serving on the team, we read and discussed the book "Joining Jesus on His Mission: How to Be An Everyday Missionary" by Pastor Greg Finke. (Some of you may recall I had our Council at Hope read and discuss this book during my first year I was here.) If you haven't read it, the entire premise of this book was, from a Biblical perspective, how we as Christians are, in many ways, "missionaries" in our own communities through the relationships that we develop in the workplace, our neighborhoods, on the farm,

in our schools, and wherever else it might be that God places you in your daily life. Pastor Finke does an outstanding job in this book of simplifying this entire model of sharing the love of Jesus, and how it happens simply by being aware of what is going on in our own little corner of the world, and using the opportunities we have in daily life to share the love of Christ in the context of the relationships we build each day.

In the Bible reading I shared with you from John 1, we see this very thing happen. Jesus goes to Galilee where he encounters Philip. There, Jesus issues a call to discipleship to Philip, simply by saying: "Follow me." Philip spends some time with Jesus, has his life transformed by the Word Jesus shares, and when he returns and sees Nathaniel, what does he say to Nathaniel? Does he act as if nothing special happened during his encounter with Jesus? No. He tells Nathaniel "We have found him of whom Moses in the Law and the prophets wrote, Jesus of Nazareth, the son of Joseph" (v.45) Philip couldn't wait to share the good news about Jesus with Nathaniel.

Nathaniel didn't give the most encouraging response right away did he? Yet, Philip was undeterred. He didn't spent time arguing with Nathaniel until he was blue in the face, or tell him he was crazy. He doesn't change the message about Jesus. And he also doesn't give up. He simply issues an invitation "Come and see" (v.46). Come and see Jesus for yourself, Nathaniel. Spend some time in His presence. And with that simple invitation, Nathaniel hears the Word of the Lord for himself, and becomes a disciple of Jesus.

I mention this because the truth is, we as God's people at Hope Lutheran Church have a wonderful gift to share with the world in which we live, starting right here in Rusk County! We have been richly blessed with the gifts of forgiveness of our sins and everlasting life in paradise through the person and work of Jesus Christ on our behalf. Through the life, death, and resurrection of Jesus, we are a people who have hope in the midst of all the darkness and bad news that we encounter in the world today. As we focus our ministry together around the four core values of the NALC: Christ-Centered, Mission-Driven, Traditionally-Grounded, and Congregationally-Focused, we are called to be salt and light to

the world around us, starting right here, right now! In a day and age where so many churches are wandering further and further away from Christ and His Word, we have made the commitment as part of the NALC to remain steadfast in Christ and His Word that gives us hope, life, and salvation.

But, we have not been called to keep this good news to ourselves. We are called to share it with others in our daily lives. That is where you come into the picture! I know I've shared this with you before. but it is worth repeating: there have been a number of studies over the years of people who join a new church, asking them, how were they brought into the life of the church they ended up joining? Two percent said it was a result of an advertisement in the newspaper or somewhere else. Six percent said they received a personal invitation from the Pastor. Another six percent said they came for the first time as a result of a specific evangelism emphasis or program that the congregation was involved with. The remaining 86% said they started attending that particular church on a regular basis because someone they knew, whether it was a friend, relative, co-worker, or neighbor, personally invited them to come to church with them, extending the same invitation Philip extended to Nathaniel.

As we get ready to gear up for our fall programming year, I have a challenge for each and every member of Hope Lutheran Church. I would like you to think about the people in your daily life for whom you might be Philip to and invite them to church here at Hope Lutheran Church and experience what Jesus is up to in our life as the Church today. Can you think of someone in your own life who perhaps you have not seen in worship at Hope in a long time? Do you have a friend or neighbor who recently moved to the area and needs the light of Christ in their life? There are people in your life who need Jesus Christ, the Light of the World, the Light no darkness can overcome. Can you begin to dream of what good things might happen if every single member of Hope Lutheran Church took this kind of initiative by simply inviting one person in their life to come and see Jesus for yourself? Perhaps God is calling you to be an everyday missionary with the people in your life!

Do You Ever Wonder Why?

Do you ever wonder why we observe certain liturgical practices or why certain symbols are used in our church practices? We continue to look at the "why" in an effort to enhance our knowledge and understanding of church practices. This month's topic is Pentecost.

Why do we use green to decorate the church during the season of Pentecost? The general theme of worship in this season is that of growth and flourishing. This season of the liturgical year focuses on growing in discipleship, deepening our relationship with God, and faithful obedience in following Jesus Christ.

This long season of green paraments is often referred to as "Ordinary Time"—"ordinary" coming from the designation of Sundays by ordinal numbers (ie 16th Sunday after Pentecost).

Scripture readings during the season of Pentecost focus on Christ's teachings, rather than commemorating his major life events.

Daily Bread

Matthew 15:29-39

In the Lord's Prayer, as we pray the petition "Give us this day our daily bread" we are reminded that these words are a promise from God that He will provide for all of our needs, both for this life, and in the life to come.

In the reading from Matthew 15, we watch as Jesus goes about answering this petition in a variety of different ways. He provides healing to those in the crowd who cannot heal themselves. He then provides for their basic need of food with simple means: bread and fish. When Jesus provided for the needs of those in our reading who cannot provide for themselves, He doesn't just give them enough to get by; He gives them an abundance, evidenced by the seven basketfuls of leftovers!

Today, our Savior, Jesus Christ, continues to provide for our needs. He provides us with the means we need to support this body and life. More importantly, He provides for our greatest need, which is to have our sins forgiven, and have the gift of a place in His Father's kingdom forever though simple means: His Word, bread and wine, which we receive every time we gather around God's gifts to us and our Savior's presence in Word and Sacrament. In what ways has Jesus provided for your daily needs today? How can you, out of thanksgiving for what He has richly blessed you with, use your abundance to share His love, and His forgiveness, with someone else in your life?

Let us pray. Heavenly Father, thank you for the many ways that You abundantly provide for all of my needs. Give me an opportunity to be Your hands and feet, and use what You have first given me in service to others, so that they may see Your love and providence through what I say, and what I do. Amen.

SUMMARY OF COUNCIL & COMMITTEE ACTION

Pastor's Report: Has been meeting with the Executive Committee to work on changes to the constitution and bylaws, as directed by the Path Forward Committee and Council. Gave a brief report on the NALC Online Convocation and the WI-UP Mission District Executive Council meeting. Confirmation orientation will be held on September 4 with classes beginning on September 11. Will lead the chapel service at Ladysmith Care & Rehab on September 4 and give the invocation at the CareNet Walk for Life on September 21.

Path Forward Recommendations Follow-Up: The banner with the new vision statement is up in the multipurpose room. The banner with a QR code that linke to the church website has arrived and will be posted on the north exterior wall after Rally Day. There are pamphlets on the basics of Christianity with stickers of the new QR code that will be placed in the sanctuary.

Flood Buckets: Rosemary Johnson is spearheading a drive to assemble flood buckets for NALC Disaster Response. As of the date of the Council meeting enough funds had been received to purchase supplies for 62 buckets.

Wedding Fee Schedule: Fees have not been updated since 2014. Council voted to make changes to the fee schedule (available in the church office). Council will also be asking for a damage deposit, which will be returned to the couple after the wedding if there is no damage to church property.

Committee Vacancy: Heidi Jo Sovacool submitted her letter of resignation from the Worship & Music Committee and chairmanship. Council accepted her resignation and will discuss filling the remaining months of her term at the next meeting.

Congregational Care & Outreach: Aileen Tauchen, Jim Spielman, and Vinnie Jacobs represented Hope Lutheran at the ICAA Back to School event. GriefShare begins September 4. Next meeting: October 2 at 4:30pm.

Parish Education: Laura gave a brief report on VBS. There were 17 children in attendance. Expenses totaled \$418.01. A Thrivent grant was received and some of the food was donated. Wednesday
